 - Examine the existing continuum of social services and support for those with mental health and addictions issues. This would include justice, supportive housing, education and vocational support.

- h. examine opportunities in the proposed transaction to strengthen Ontario's role as a financial services centre, and consider potential risks

- Consider the mental health and addiction needs of children and young adults
- Consider the mental health and addiction needs of First Nations (on- and off-reserve), Inuit and Métis peoples
- Consider the mental health needs and addiction needs of seniors
- Identify ways to leverage existing opportunities and initiatives within the current mental health and addictions system
- Explore innovative approaches to service delivery in the community
- Identify opportunities to improve co-ordination and integration across the sectors for all people including those with concurrent mental health and addiction problems
- Recognize the importance of early intervention and health promotion with respect to diagnosing and treating mental health and addictions issue
- Consider the mental health and addiction needs of Francophone and Ethnic minorities facing linguistic and cultural gaps.
- Examine access to care issues for persons with mental health and addictions issues including primary and emergency care
- Examine the existing continuum of social services and support for those with mental health and addictions issues. This would include justice, supportive housing, education and vocational support.

Mr. Delaney – That in the opinion of this House, the Government of Ontario, through the Ministry of Transportation, shall publish by June 30, 2010, an updated project schedule for the Metrolinx Regional Transportation Plan, reviewing the priorities set out in 2007 by that date to place the highest priorities for capacity expansion of inter-regional rail capacity on those regions with the greatest population growth.
Debated and carried March 11, 2010.
3. Mr. Berardinetti – That, in the opinion of this House, the Legislative Assembly of Ontario believes the Government of Ontario should develop a strategy, along with local and national sports organizations, to ensure Ontario athletes win and succeed, and compete in the finest and most honourable traditions of Canadian sport, when Ontario hosts the 2015 Pan Am Games.

- acknowledging that the Georgetown South Corridor be declared a priority corridor for electrification of commuter trains recognizing its high residential density;
 - ensuring that the Environmental Assessment for electrification become consistent with current timelines of the 6 month Transit Environmental Assessment;
 - including human health and property impacts in the Environmental Assessment for electrification;
 - completing the electrification of the Air-Rail Link by 2015;
 - calling on all levels of government to partner in funding electrification infrastructure improvements.

Debated and carried February 24, 2011.

64. Mr. Clark – That, in the opinion of this House, the McGuinty Government should acknowledge that Ontario families do not have an infinite ability to pay for the Premier’s energy experiments, stop the collection of secret energy taxes under section 26.1 of the Ontario Energy Board Act, and reimburse families the money they have already paid on secret energy taxes.
Debated December 2, 2010 and vote deferred to December 6, 2010.
Lost on division December 6, 2010.
65. Mrs. Elliott – That, in the opinion of this House, the McGuinty Government should honour its commitment as set out in the FLOW agreement with the Federal Government, dated March 2, 2007, and “complete the extension of Highway 407 eastward from Brock Road to Highway 35/115 with construction to begin in 2009 and to be completed in 2013, including provisions for a dedicated transit right-of-way”.
Debated and lost on division February 24, 2011.
66. Mr. Hillier – That, in the opinion of this House, the Canadian Charter of Rights and Freedoms should be amended to enshrine property rights for Ontarians, as follows:-
1. The following section is inserted after section 7:
7.1 (1) In Ontario, everyone has the right not to be deprived, by any Act of the Legislative Assembly or by any action taken under authority of an Act of the Legislative Assembly, of the title, use, or enjoyment of real property, or of any right attached to real property, or of any improvement made to or upon real property, unless made whole by means of full, just and timely financial compensation.
(2) Subsection (1) refers to any Act of the Legislative Assembly made before or after the coming into force of this section.
 2. This Amendment may be cited as the Constitution Amendment, 2011 (No Expropriation in Ontario without Compensation), and reference to the Constitution Acts, 1867 to 1982 shall be deemed to include a reference to the Constitution Amendment, 2011 (No Expropriation in Ontario without Compensation).
67. Mr. Brown – That, in the opinion of this House, the Legislative Assembly of Ontario, in recognition of the role Ontario’s firefighters play every day in keeping our communities safe, and in recognition of the evidence of health and safety risks to firefighters over the age of 60, and in keeping with recent Human Rights Tribunal decisions, calls on the Government to introduce legislation allowing for the mandatory retirement of firefighters who are involved in fire suppression activities in the province of Ontario.
Debated and carried on division March 10, 2011.
68. Mr. Zimmer – That, in the opinion of this House, the Government of Ontario should recognize and proclaim September 21 as the International Day of Peace in Ontario.
69. Mr. Clark – That, in the opinion of this House, the Standing Committee on the Legislative Assembly should consider changes to the Standing Orders and current conventions governing Oral Question Period with respect to, among other things: (i) measures which would enhance the ability of Opposition Members to ask questions of Government Ministers, (ii) the Standing Orders that enable Ministers to both refer questions asked of them to other Ministers and to decline to answer any question asked of them, (iii) dedicating Tuesday for Oral Question Period to the Premier, (iv) dedicating Monday, Wednesday and Thursday for Oral Question Period to Ministers other than the Premier, which would be based on a published schedule that would ensure an equitable distribution of Ministers across a fixed period, but can be subject to change should urgent questions arise that require answers from specific Ministers, (v) allocating the majority of questions at each Question Period for Members who would be selected at random through a ballot draw, (vi) reviewing the convention that Ministers need not attend a “late show”, (vii) enabling Members who are dissatisfied with the written responses they receive from Ministers to questions they have placed on the Order Paper to call a “late show”; and that the Committee report its findings to the House, recommending changes to the Standing Orders and current conventions governing Oral Question Period, within six months of commencing its review.

70. Mr. Dhillon – That, in the opinion of this House, the Legislative Assembly of Ontario
- recognizes that over 28 per cent of Ontarians are born outside the country and the province welcomes almost half of all new immigrants coming to Canada and that these newcomers make vital contributions to our province;
 - calls on the newly elected federal government to take immediate action to support the integration of newcomers to Ontario by committing to invest in services for newcomers in Ontario on an equitable level with other Provinces and immediately commence negotiations with the Ontario government on a comprehensive new agreement that provides fairness to Ontario through adequate funding, planning and governance necessary for all newcomers to succeed and for the future prosperity of Ontario’s economy and the quality of life of our people.
- Mr. Dhillon – That in the opinion of this House, a newly elected federal government must immediately negotiate a new Canada-Ontario Immigration agreement that allows Ontario to assume control of the delivery of programs and services to help newcomers settle and succeed and must ensure that the agreement provides newcomers in Ontario equal treatment to those in Manitoba, Quebec and British Columbia.
Debated and carried March 31, 2011.
71. Mr. Barrett – That, in the opinion of this House, the Government of Ontario should initiate a review of current penalties for possession/transportation of live Asian Carp to develop more severe consequences, and other measures, that would better deter the establishment of this devastating species in the Great Lakes.
72. Mr. Klees – That, in the opinion of this House, the Standing Orders should be amended to require that any Private Member’s Bill having been referred to a Standing Committee be considered by that Committee and reported back to the House no later than twelve sessional days following its referral; and further, that any Private Member’s Bill ordered for Third Reading shall be called for Third Reading no later than twelve sessional days following the Order.
73. Mr. Yakabuski – **REASONED AMENDMENT** – That the motion for Second Reading of Bill 179, An Act to amend the Child and Family Services Act respecting adoption and the provision of care and maintenance, be amended by deleting all the words after “That” and substituting therefor the words “This Bill be NOT now read a Second time but be referred back to the Government with instructions to conduct further consultations with client groups.”
74. Mr. Dunlop – That, in the opinion of this House, the Government of Ontario should develop a comprehensive business plan, including a consultation process before the closures of any of the jails are finalized in the communities of Sarnia, Walkerton and Owen Sound.
75. Mr. Johnson – That, in the opinion of this House, the Government should explore the feasibility of expanding Eldercollege, or similar programs in Ontario, in order to serve adults over the age of 55 who wish to enrich their lifestyle through active involvement education.
Debated and carried May 12, 2011.
76. Mr. Arnott – **REASONED AMENDMENT** – That the motion for Second Reading of Bill 196, An Act to amend the Election Act with respect to certain electoral practices, be amended by deleting all the words after “That” and substituting therefore the words “This Bill be NOT now read a Second time but be referred back to the Government with instructions to incorporate therein:
- Amendments that prevent the Working Families Coalition from providing attack advertising on behalf of the Ontario Liberal Party during the 2011 Election Campaign, similar to amendments proposed in Bill 195, the *Banning Collusion in Electoral Advertising Act, 2011.*”

77. Mr. Colle – That, in the opinion of this House, the Legislative Assembly of Ontario should proclaim the month of May of each year as Jewish Heritage Month throughout the Province of Ontario so that the outstanding achievements and contributions made by Ontarians of Jewish Heritage can be recognized and celebrated.
78. Mr. Tabuns – That, in the opinion of this House, any offers made by Ontario with regard to the Canada-EU Trade Agreement be made public and open for commentary before they are put on the Canada-EU Trade Agreement bargaining table.

SPRING PERIOD 2010

1. Mr. Hudak - That the Legislative Assembly of Ontario call on the Premier of Ontario to adopt the principle that if you do not lose your job, you do not collect severance, and cancel severance payments to HST tax collectors who keep their jobs. Addressed to the Premier of Ontario.
Debated and lost on division March 30, 2010.
2. Mrs. Elliott – That the Legislative Assembly of Ontario calls upon the Premier of Ontario to guarantee that Ontario seniors will not have to pay increased prices or have services reduced as a result of cuts the McGuinty Liberals made to frontline health care delivered by independent local pharmacists, announced on April 7, 2010. Addressed to the Premier of Ontario.
Debated and lost on division April 21, 2010.
3. Mr. Yakabuski – That the Legislative Assembly of Ontario calls for a moratorium on all wind farm projects until an independent, comprehensive study of the health and environmental impacts of wind farms is completed and Premier McGuinty restores the planning authority governing them to municipalities and local boards. Addressed to the Premier of Ontario.
Debated and lost on division April 28, 2010.
4. Ms. Horwath – That, in the opinion of this House, at the Finance Ministers' meeting on pensions in June, the Ontario government should advocate for the strengthening and expansion of the Canada Pension Plan.

At home, the Ontario government can ensure that the 65% of Ontarians who currently lack a workplace pension have access to a decent retirement income by implementing an Ontario Retirement Plan that would:

- Ensure that all Ontario workers who want a workplace pension plan, have a workplace pension plan;
- Ensure that workers who believe they have a better way of saving for their retirement are able to opt-out;
- Ensure that all employers match their participating employees' minimum contribution rate;
- Phase-in contribution rates in a prudent and responsible manner for all employees and employers with particular attention paid to the unique circumstances of small business employers and their employees. Addressed to the Premier of Ontario.

Debated and lost on division May 11, 2010.

FALL PERIOD 2010

1. Mr. Yakabuski – That the Legislative Assembly of Ontario calls upon the McGuinty government to suspend the Smart Meter time-of-use program until billing problems are fixed and Ontario families are given the option of whether to participate in the time-of-use program. Addressed to the Minister of Energy.
Debated and lost on division September 28, 2010.

Section 6C-2

2. Mrs. Elliott – That the Legislative Assembly of Ontario calls on the government to prohibit all hospitals, Local Health Integration Networks, Community Care Access Centres, Cancer Care Ontario, eHealth Ontario and other publicly-funded health care bodies from hiring consultants to lobby government officials, and to require all publicly-funded health care bodies to post travel and hospitality expenses publicly. Addressed to the Premier of Ontario.
Debated and lost on division October 6, 2010.
3. Mr. Yakabuski – That the Legislative Assembly of Ontario calls upon the McGuinty Government to make the terms of the Samsung contract – known as the Korean Green Energy Investment Agreement – public, including performance indicators, penalty provisions, any dates either side can terminate the contract with or without penalty, who signed the contract, who negotiated the contract or lobbied for the contract on the Government’s behalf, any subsidies included in the contract, and the total cost to ratepayers. Addressed to the Premier of Ontario.
Debated and lost on division October 27, 2010.
4. Ms. Horwath – That the Legislative Assembly of Ontario calls upon the McGuinty Government to immediately remove the HST from all Ontario hydro bills. Addressed to the Premier of Ontario.
Debated and lost on division November 1, 2010.
5. Mr. Miller (Parry Sound–Muskoka) – That the Legislative Assembly of Ontario calls for the current balance and amount paid to date of the Residual Stranded Debt be displayed in the Annual Report of the Ontario Electricity Financial Corp. and on hydro bills so Ontario families will know how much longer they will pay the Debt Retirement Charge. Addressed to the Minister of Finance.
Debated and lost on division November 23, 2010.

SPRING PERIOD 2011

1. Mr. Miller (Parry Sound–Muskoka) – That although in 2002 the Residual Stranded Debt was \$7.8 billion, and since then Ontario families have paid \$7.8 (billion) in Debt Retirement Charges, and yet the McGuinty government will continue to charge the Debt Retirement Charge on hydro bills.
Therefore, the Legislative Assembly of Ontario calls on the McGuinty government to instruct an external firm to conduct a forensic audit into the residual stranded debt and the debt retirement charge, and make the findings of the audit public. Addressed to the Minister of Finance.
Debated and lost on division March 2, 2011.
2. Mrs. Elliott – That the Legislative Assembly of Ontario in recognition of the crisis that Ontario families are facing in finding mental health and addictions treatment for their loved ones, particularly children, calls on the McGuinty Government to table a mental health and addictions plan that reflects the recommendations made by the Select Committee, within 60 days. Addressed to the Minister of Health and Long-Term Care.
Debated and carried March 9, 2011.
3. Mr. Yakabuski – That the Legislative Assembly recognizes the Ontario Power Authority was set up as a temporary agency, but in less than six years it has become a bloated bureaucracy ballooning from 15 to more than 300 employees, spending \$80 million a year, contributing to skyrocketing energy bills paid by Ontario families and has been a driving force behind Premier McGuinty’s expensive energy experiments, and therefore calls on the Ontario Government to dismantle the OPA. Addressed to the Minister of Energy.
Debated and lost on division March 28, 2011.

Section 6C-3

4. Ms. Horwath – That, in the opinion of this House, the McGuinty Government has failed to adequately consult Northern Ontarians, their communities, industries and First Nations on issues of critical importance to the region’s future. The decision not to hold public hearings on Bill 151 in the North and the same lack of consultation on the part of the McGuinty Government, in cooperation with the Harper Government, to impose the HST demonstrates a lack of respect for Northern Ontario. We call on the McGuinty Government to commit to a consultation process that ensures that decisions about Northern Ontario are made in the North and not dictated by Queen’s Park. Addressed to the Premier.

Debated and lost on division April 20, 2011.

5. Ms. MacLeod – That in 2003, Premier Dalton McGuinty signed a pledge not to raise taxes on Ontario families before forcing them to pay higher personal, corporate, income, and payroll taxes. He brought in the largest personal income tax increase in provincial history with the Health tax and the largest sales tax increase with the HST. He also increased the tax burden on Ontario families through tire taxes, eco-taxes, electronic taxes, the diamond tax, hidden hydro taxes, destination marketing taxes and higher beer, wine and spirits taxes. Therefore the Legislative Assembly of Ontario calls on Premier Dalton McGuinty not to create any new taxes, including a carbon tax, or hike the HST that Ontario families pay. Addressed to the Premier of Ontario.

Debated and lost on division May 11, 2011.
